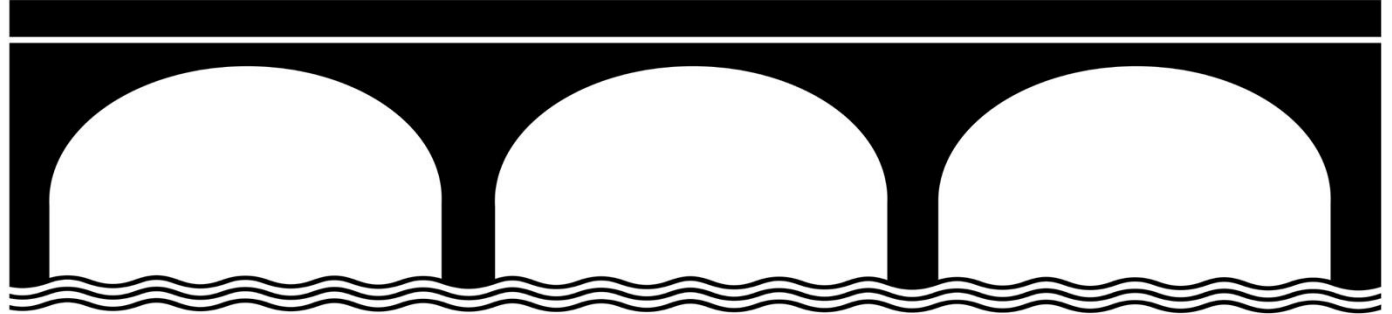


# COLLINGHAM WITH LINTON PARISH COUNCIL

## **Public Rights of Way at Compton**

The Parish Council are currently applying for a Public Right of Way modification order at Compton, following complaints from local horse and bike riders informing us that they can no longer access it. ## Litter Problems

Litter around the centre of Collingham, particularly by the shops, is being reported regularly to us by residents. Leeds City Council can take legal action if someone is caught dropping litter or throwing it out of vehicles. This includes paper, chewing gum, cans, bottles, waste food, food and drink containers, plastic and cigarette ends.

There is a £100 fixed penalty fine and failure to can result in prosecution leading to a maximum fine of £2,500 if found guilty. If you see someone dropping litter or throwing it from a vehicle, please report it:
