- Project starting May – Linton Lane
 - Other routes -Northgate Lane to Sicklinghall/Wetherby via Golf Club alternative routes
 - Footpath at Compton to be made a bridleway following modification order process

Highway safety

- Well maintained highways
- Traffic safety
 - Additional SIDS/use of speed cameras
 - Dealing with 'double yellow line offenders'

Resident safety

- Safe and well maintained footways
- Coordinated Neighbourhood watch
- Ginnel Lighting project



Precious Green Spaces

- More floral displays
 - Watering and deadheading volunteers
 - Plan to introduce all year round hanging baskets, troughs, flower beds
- Plan for Spring/Summer/Autumn planting triangle opposite the Windmill
 - Resource required to 'adopt' it to keep it pristine
- Additional trees the village wants to protect
 - Using data gathered from the survey
 - Identify landowners
 - Lobby Leeds City Council – try and add to our current protected tree list
- Coordinated little and often litter picking
 - Purple bag holder volunteer required

Financial Highlights

Precept kept at 95k following debate to reduce to 85k

19.546k mortgage payment for Glebe Field ongoing to 2025

17k expenditure including fencing to public space behind 2 Millbeck green/new path and barrier Beck Wood/Compton Modification order consultancy/lots of planting

14k maintaining our assets

5.7k grants and community support

MUGA - escalating costs decision taken not to proceed
